# **COVID-19: Maryland's State Relief Efforts**



<b>Individual</b>	No price gouging on food, fuel, medicine, and other essential items
	Workers cannot be terminated because they have been isolated or quarantined
	The Secretary of Labor can extend unemployment benefits to workers who cannot work because they are quarantined, at risk for exposure, or are caring for a family member impacted by COVID-19.
	90 day extension of tax payments for individuals and businesses with a new due date of July 15, 2020
	All licenses, permits, registrations, and other authorizations issued by the state, that would expire during the current state of emergency will be extended until at least the 30th day after the state of emergency is lifted
	A utility or “residential service company” cannot shut off service for a lack of bill payment
	Expanded child care access for essential workers
<b>Small Business</b>	Small Business COVID-19 Relief Grant and Loan Programs – Commerce is NO LONGER ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS
<b>Small &amp; Large Business</b>	Maryland COVID-19 Emergency Relief Manufacturing Fund
	The Maryland Department of Labor’s Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing is extending license expiration dates until May 1, 2020 – which is subject to being extended
	Certain vehicle weight limits have been waived to maintain delivery of supplies and equipment
	MARBIDCO – Pandemic Adjustment Load Fund Program for food and fiber producers
	Layoff Aversion Fund/ Worksharing – NO LONGER ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS
